Definitions	
Affiliates	 Companies related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and non-financial companies. Our affiliates include companies with common control such as Matrix Investment Holdings LLC and Matrix Advisors, LLC.
Non-affiliates	Companies not related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and non-financial companies.
	• Matrix does not share with nonaffiliates so they can market to you.
Joint marketing	A formal agreement between non-affiliated financial companies that together market financial products or services to you.
